

Literacy	Maths	Topic: Transport and Journeys
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Create track paintings by rolling cars through paint.</li> <li>• Practice name writing and encourage your child to hold their pencil using a tripod grip</li> <li>• Read a variety of transport themed stories and non-fiction books</li> <li>• Paint or draw different modes of transport.</li> <li>• Phase 1 Phonics games (see links below)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Counting out up to ten objects from a larger set and begin to match quantities to their numeral (beyond 10 if your child is ready)</li> <li>• Orally counting to 10 and 20</li> <li>• Write some numbers on squares of paper so children can do number ordering to 10. Take a number away from their number line and ask children to say what the missing number is,</li> <li>• Encourage the use of positional language when describing the journeys made by different types of transport, e.g. the tractor drives <u>through</u> the farm, the boat travels <u>on</u> the water</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Design your own mode of transport using 2D and 3D objects you have around your home</li> <li>• Sorting transport with wheels and no wheels</li> <li>• Children could set up a "car wash" And wash different types of transport toys you might have in your home!</li> <li>• Use large pieces of paper to draw roads and maps for your toy transport to travel on!</li> </ul>
